ORDINANCE NO. _____ of 2026

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF JESSUP, LACKAWANNA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF PARKING ON THE 200 BLOCK OF DOLPH STREET WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF JESSUP

The Borough of Jessup hereby enacts and ordains the following:

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby **ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup, County of Lackawanna and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Jessup is a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the “Municipality”); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Jessup is responsible for enacting Ordinances and enforcing matters associated with the health, safety and welfare of the Borough’s residents; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup finds that it is in the best interest of its residents to permit on street parking along the East side of Dolph Street at a forty-five (45) degree angle to the sidewalk next to the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 5544, located at 205 Dolph Street, Jessup, Pennsylvania, beginning at the intersection of Second Avenue and Dolph Street and extending to the utility pole on Dolph Street.

Section 1. Parking.

Patrons of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 5544 shall be permitted to park on the East side of Dolph Street at a forty-five (45) degree angle in abutting spots and as lined by the Borough of Jessup or its designee.

Section 2. Restrictions.

Parking shall not be permitted in excess of the spots designated by the Borough of Jessup. Any unauthorized addition, modification or removal of the Borough’s parking designation shall be a violation of this Ordinance and punishable as set forth herein.

No vehicle shall be permitted to be parked in a manner that does not conform to the designated parking spots nor in a manner that interferes with the flow of traffic on Dolph Street or on Second Avenue.

Section 3. Enforcement.

It shall be the duty of the Police Department of the Borough of Jessup to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Violations and Penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violates any provision of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall pay a fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) plus costs. Each day that a violation occurs or continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 5. Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable and if any provision shall be deemed to be invalid for any reason, the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall not affect. It is hereby declared as the intention of the Borough Council of the Borough of Duryea that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such invalidity not been included therein.

Section 6. Repealer. Any Ordinance or part of an Ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and the same is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or otherwise illegal or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Section 9. Invalidity. If any section, subsection, sentence or clause of this Ordinance is held, for any reason, to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

RESOLUTION NO. 11 OF 2026

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR SAFE STREETS LACKAWANNA

WHEREAS, Lackawanna County has developed and adopted the Safe Streets Lackawanna – Safe Streets for All Action Plan, a countywide, data-driven effort supported by the U.S. Department of Transportation that establishes a goal of reducing fatal and serious injury crashes by fifty percent (50%) by the year 2045, and which documents that 87 of the 399 fatal and serious injury crashes occurring between 2019 and 2023 happened on municipally-owned roadways, highlighting the important role municipalities play in improving roadway safety, and outlines strategies informed by local crash data, public input, and coordination with municipalities and partner agencies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Jessup Borough that:

1. **Support for the Plan.** Jessup Borough expresses its support for the goals, principles, and overall direction of the Safe Streets Lackawanna Action Plan.
2. **Commitment to Safer Streets.** Jessup Borough supports efforts to improve traffic safety for all roadway users, including drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit users.
3. **Coordination with the County.** Jessup Borough will work, as appropriate, with Lackawanna County and partner agencies to advance roadway safety initiatives and improvements on locally-owned roadways.
